	b. Always try using this tool first (easiest of the tools to use)				
	c. Tricks with this tool:				
	i. Always use a <u>smaller</u> size brush (Ex. 10 Hard Brush)				
	3. Color-Based Selections

	a. Magic Wand Tool (Selects all pixels of a particular color or color				
	range)				
	b. Tricks with this tool:				
	i. Better to use in <u>larger</u> areas (not with small detail)				
	ii. Tolerance Setting = sensitivity of the tool				
	1. Ex. Setting of 32 = 32 lighter/darker tones of that color				
	iii. Multicolored Object in a solid background?				
	1. Would be easier to select the background first (then				
	Select > Inverse)				
	iv. Contiguous setting \rightarrow Selects areas touching one another				
	Unchecking would select all areas of image

	CONTROL + D	<u>Deselects</u>		
	SHIFT + CTRL + I	Reverses Selection (Inverse Selection)		
	CONTROL + CLICK THUMBNAIL in LAYERS	Selects all objects in that layer		
	PANEL Arrow Keys	Move object one pixel over		
	SHIFT + Arrow Keys	Moves object ten pixels over per click of key		
	Selection Tool + SHIFT	Adds to the selection		
	Selection Tool + ALT	Removes from what has been selected
