

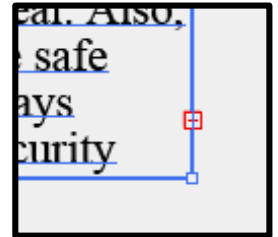



	<p><b>Point Type vs. Area Type</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Point Type                             <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. <b>Horizontal or vertical line of text that begins where you click</b></li> <li>b. Each line of text is <b>independent</b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>i. Meaning the line <b>expands/shrinks</b> as you edit it</li> </ol> </li> <li>c. If you resize this text box, the text will <b>stretch</b></li> <li>d. When is it the most useful? → <b>With a headline or a few words</b></li> </ol> </li> <li>2. Area Type                             <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. <b>Uses the boundaries of an object to control the flow of characters</b></li> <li>b. <b>"Clicking and Dragging"</b> a text box</li> <li>c. Text <b>automatically wraps</b> to fit inside the defined area</li> <li>d. When is it the most useful? → <b>Create one or more paragraphs</b></li> </ol> </li> </ol>
	<p><b>Oh Oh A Red Plus Sign!!</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Means the text <b>does not fit in the text box</b></li> <li>• What do you do?                             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ <b>Resize</b> the text box OR</li> <li>○ <b>Threading</b> the text                                     <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Continues text from one object to another</li> <li>▪ Click the "red plus sign"</li> <li>▪ The mouse pointer changes  to the Loaded Text Icon</li> <li>▪ Then use point or area type  to create a new object for the text to continue at</li> </ul> </li> </ul> </li> </ul>
	<p><b>What You Should Know About Type</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Text boxes can be reshaped using the <b>Direct Selection Tool</b></li> <li>• Use this keyboard shortcut to resize text: <b>CTRL + SHIFT + &lt;&gt;</b></li> <li>• Want to create columns? → <b>Type &gt; Area Type Options</b></li> <li>• Wrapping text around objects → <b>Object &gt; Text Wrap &gt; Make</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Or Choose "Text Wrap Options" to create greater space between text and object</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Need to include text in your Live Paint Object? → <b>Type &gt; Create Outlines</b></li> </ul>

	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Character Styles (retains text formatting characteristics and applies them to selected text) (Use Character Styles Panel)</li> </ol>
	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>2. Paragraph Styles (retains text and paragraph attributes and applies them to an entire paragraph) (Use Paragraph Styles Panel)</li> </ol>
	<p><b><u>What Does A Fish, A Flag, and Arcs Have In Common?</u></b></p>
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• They are all ways you can warp text (changing the shape of text)</li> </ul>
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Two ways:             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Click the <b>Make Envelope</b> button</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ OR Effect &gt; Warp &gt; (Choose an Warping Effect)</li> </ul>
	
	<p><b><u>Typing In Shapes, On Shapes, and On Paths</u></b></p>
	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Typing In Shapes             <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. Place mouse pointer inside shape until it looks like a <b><u>"rounded dotted circle"</u></b></li> <li>b. Click Mouse</li> </ol> </li> </ol>
	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>2. Typing On Shapes             <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. Place mouse pointer on path of shape</li> <li>b. Hold <b>ALT</b></li> <li>c. Mouse pointer becomes a <b><u>"diagonal dotted line"</u></b></li> <li>d. Click Mouse</li> </ol> </li> </ol>
	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>3. Typing on Paths             <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. Place mouse on path until mouse pointer becomes a <b><u>"diagonal dotted line"</u></b></li> <li>b. Click Mouse</li> </ol> </li> </ol>
	<p><b><u>Buttons to Know From the Character Panel</u></b></p>
	 Leading: <b><u>changing your spacing between lines of characters</u></b>
	 Kerning: <b><u>spacing between two characters</u></b>
	 Tracking: <b><u>spacing between more than two characters</u></b>
