	Point Type vs. Area Type
	1. Point Type a. Horizontal or vertical line of text that begins where you click b. Each line of text is independent i. Meaning the line expands/shrinks as you edit it c. If you resize this text box, the text will stretch d. When is it the most useful? → With a headline or a few words
	2. Area Type
	a. Uses the boundaries of an object to control the flow of
	b. "Clicking and Dragging" a text box c. Text automatically wraps to fit inside the defined area d. When is it the most useful? → Create one or more paragraphs Oh Oh A Red Plus Sign!! • Means the text does not fit in the text box • What do you do? • Resize the text box OR • Threading the text • Continues text from one object to another • Click the "red plus sign" • The mouse pointer changes • Then use point or area type for the text to continue at

	 Text boxes can be reshaped using the <u>Direct Selection Tool</u> Use this keyboard shortcut to resize text: <u>CTRL + SHIFT + <></u> Want to create columns? → <u>Type > Area Type Options</u> Wrapping text around objects → <u>Object > Text Wrap > Make</u> Or Choose "Text Wrap Options" to create greater space between text and object Need to include text in your Live Paint Object? → <u>Type > Create Outlines</u>

	 Character Styles (retains text formatting characteristics and applies them to selected text) (Use Character Styles Panel) Paragraph Styles (retains text and paragraph attributes and applies them to an entire paragraph) (Use Paragraph Styles Panel)
	What Does A Fish, A Flag, and Arcs Have In Common?
	Common? They are all ways you can warp text (changing the shape of text) Two ways: Click the Make Envelope button OR Effect > Warp > (Choose an Warping Effect)
	Typing In Shapes, On Shapes, and On Paths
	1. Typing In Shapes a. Place mouse pointer inside shape until it looks like a "rounded dotted circle" b. Click Mouse
	 2. Typing On Shapes a. Place mouse pointer on path of shape b. Hold <u>ALT</u> c. Mouse pointer becomes a "<u>diagonal dotted line</u>" d. Click Mouse
	3. Typing on Paths a. Place mouse on path until mouse pointer becomes a "diagonal dotted line" b. Click Mouse
	Buttons to Know From the Character Panel
	Leading: changing your spacing between lines of characters
	Kerning: spacing between two characters
	Tracking: spacing between more than two characters
